JOHN 15:18-27

I. Jesus the loving Savior is also the hated Savior (John 15:18).



- When we are rejected, how does it help to know that Jesus was hated first?
- How are we, and how should we be living as followers of this hated Savior?

II. Jesus, the hated Savior, called us out of the world to do His will (v.19-21).



- Do you think that the world loves us as if we are its own?
- What are our responsibilities in imitating Jesus in this aspect of His life?

III. Jesus revealed sin to people and many hated Him for it (v.22-25).



- **What is it about revealing sin that moves men to hate such a loving Savior?**
- **What is it about His miracles that develops such strong rejection?**
- **Knowing what we do about this rejection, what are we called to do?**

IV. The Spirit testifies concerning this hated Savior (v. 26).



- What work of the Spirit is described here?
- What is our role in the testifying work of the Spirit?

V. Those who have been with Jesus, are also called to testify (v.27).



- **Who “must” testify of the loving and hated Savior?**
- **What is our responsibility of testifying to what Christ has done in our lives?**
