

## KNOWING JESUS, THE MAN OF PRAYER




**JOHN 17:1-26** 

I. Jesus prayed for glory that would let Him glorify the Father –John 17:1-5.




 Why is His plea for glory not selfseeking?

 How should we be praying for strengths and blessings? II. Jesus prayed for His disciples instead of praying for the world (v.6-12).




- Since Jesus loves the whole world, why didn't He pray for them?

 When we pray for others, what should be the nature of our requests? III. Jesus prays for God to protect and enable His disciples (v.13-19).




Why would Jesus say that His disciples were not of this world?

 How do the prayer requests of Jesus affect the ministry of prayer? IV. Jesus prays for all of His followers to be perfected in unity (v.20-24).




 Of all the things Jesus could pray for, why the emphasis on unity?
