
## I KNOW THAT MY REDEEMER LIVES



JOB 19:25-27


I. In Joshua and soon in Ruth we read about a 'kinsman-redeemer' (Ruth 2:20).

## II. Job, in the midst of trials trusted in his redeemer (Job 19:25-27).



 In the face of such terrible trials, how could Job have this kind of faith?

 Because we have seen the resurrection of Christ, what assurance can we have?

## III. Today we have more reason to trust in our redeemer (John 20:1-9).



• Because of the open tomb, what assurance can we have?

 Because of all the witnesses' accounts, what assurance can we have? (v.19-20)

 Because of the transformation of the disciples, what assurance can we have? IV. We can also rejoice because He is our kinsman-redeemer (Hebrews 2:11).



 What assurance came to Ruth because Boaz was a relative?

 What assurance comes to us because Christ is our brother? V. We can have full confidence in our capable redeemer (II Timothy 1:12).



 What have we entrusted into the care of our redeemer?

 How confident are we in His ability to protect it?
