 What does that say about not inheriting sin? (Matthew 18:1-4) IV. A righteous grandson will not inherit his dad's sin (Ezekiel 18:14-20).



 What would happen to our relationship with God if we had to share guilt?

 How would we view Jesus' sacrifice if it was primarily atoning for Adam's sin? V. When the righteous or unrighteous repent then destiny changes (v.21-32).

 If God was pleased with the death of the wicked, what would it say about Him?
