 What does this passage tell us about the Christian's purpose?

III. Our purpose involves maturing others by proclaiming Christ (1:28).



 How does our being close to Jesus motivate us to call others to Him? (John 1:35-42)

 What happens to the people who are close to Jesus? (Mark 3:13-15)

 Why does our purpose continue on even after people are brought to Jesus? (Colossians 1:28)

IV. We struggle and work with all His powerful energy (Colossians 1:29).

 Who would describe your life as one of toiling and struggling for Christ?

 Why is 'getting saved' not a biblical purpose for the Christian life?

 How can we allow Christ to more powerfully work through us? (Romans 2:4)
